Website accessibility declaration for Private Subjects pursuant to art. 3 paragraph 1 of Law no. 4 of 9 January 2004

Declaration

Trenord undertakes to make its mobile app accessible, in accordance with Law no. 4 of 9 January 2004. This accessibility statement applies to: **Trenord App - v.4.9.1 Android**

Compliance status:

Partially compliant

This mobile app partially complies with the requirements of Appendix A of the UNI CEI EN 301549 standard due to the cases of non-compliance listed below

Content not accessible

The contents listed below are not accessible for the following reasons in compliance with Law no. 4 of 9 January 2004:

- C.11.1.1.1 - Some non-text content presented to the user does not have an equivalent text alternative that serves the same purpose;
- C.11.1.3.1 - In some cases, information, structure or correlations conveyed by the presentation of the pages cannot be programmatically determined (or are not available by text);
- C.11.1.3.2 - In some cases, where the sequence in which the content is presented affects its meaning, this is only visual and not structural;
- C.11.1.3.4 - The display and operation of some content does not vary depending on the orientation of the screen;
- C.11.1.4.1 - In some cases was color alone used to identify a purpose or distinguish a piece of information or a function;
- C.11.1.4.3 - The visual representation of text and images containing text does not always have the minimum contrast ratio required, except for exceptions provided for by the legislation (e.g. logos);

the text of the link together with adjacent content;

- C.11.2.4.6 - Headings and/or labels do not sufficiently clarify content or functionality;
- C.11.2.5.3 - For some user interface components with labels that include text or images of text, the name read from the aids does not contain the text that is presented visually;
- C.11.3.1.1 - Some pages do not define the language;
- C.11.3.3.2 - In some cases, no labels or instructions are provided when the content requires input actions from the user;
- C.11.4.1.2 - In some cases the user interface components (including: form elements, links and scripted components...), name, role, states, properties and values are incorrect or set or the user and his assistive technologies are not warned when these change;

Drafting of the accessibility statement
